This exhibition invites you on a journey of metamorphosis bringing together emblematic figures of modern art such as Fernando Botero, Pablo Picasso & Frank Stella and contemporary artists such as Johan Van Mullem, Barbara Kandiyoti, Marc Renard and Kwon Jukhee.

The exhibition celebrates art as an ongoing process of transformation.

Each artist pushes the boundaries to reveal new perspectives on the world.

Whether it is Picasso's bold distortions or Botero's generous curves, Johan Van Mullem's dreamlike portraits or Kwon Jukhee's book-like sculptures...

These artists don't simply represent reality, they reinvent it, deconstruct it and transform it.

Picasso's cubism dialogues with Botero's enlarged human figures while Stella's geometric experimentation finds an echo in the contemporary and organic approach of Barbara Kandiyoti.

Whether in terms of medium or concept, each work embodies an evolution, a transition from a raw idea to an intriguing artistic realisation.

Marc Renard uses partially translucent polyester canvases on which he paints on both sides.

This unique process creates an enchanting depth in which saturated fluorescent colours interact harmoniously with the polyester offering a captivating visual experience.

For her part, Kwon Jukhee transforms everyday objects into poetic sculptures reinventing the uses and meanings of the material.

Combining modernity and contemporaneity, this exhibition highlights a fascinating dynamic, that of an intergenerational dialogue in which artistic codes evolve, transform and metamorphose.









Pablo Picasso, at the age of 72, opened his sketchbook in his studio in Vallauris on November 28, 1953, and produced 180 beautiful drawings by February 3, 1954.

Picasso simply put down on paper the images that crossed his mind during those nine weeks at a pivotal point in his life. Faced with loneliness and aging, he retreated to his studio and engaged in a frenetic creative process, seeking to transcend his anguish through art.

His concept of the role of art, that of a lifelong mistress to whom the artist surrenders himself unreservedly, without vanity or exaggerated notions of "vocation," is illustrated by the frequency with which he used the theme of the painter and his model.

The studio becomes a theater where a humorous and introspective fable about the creative process is played out.

The series of drawings collected under the title "La Comédie Humaine" is a key work in Picasso's career, a distillation of his graphic virtuosity, his biting humor and his profound reflection on the human and artistic condition. With this series, he once again confirmed his talent for blending the burlesque and the tragic, the intimate and the universal, in a rich and inexhaustible creation.

Picasso proves to us here that the man of genius, who can achieve anything he wants with his brain and his ten fingers, comes up, like the rest of us, against the fundamental facts of life, a game that inevitably ends in checkmate.
